General Processes for International Students After Being Accepted to Grad School

Three categories of acceptance

- Initial Acceptance-Student Intent to register; Net ID set up; Finances; follow instructions to submit documentation as indicated by Int'l Offices
- Transfer-Student Intent to Register, Transfer form; Finances; Additional immigration documents; follow instructions to submit documentation as indicated by Int'l Offices
- Change of Academic Level (Undergrad to Graduate Level) at current School- Inform your International Office after you have been admitted. Be ready to provide finances to update your current I-20 with the latest education level.

Finances For 1 Year Cost of Attendance

- Scholarship
- Assistantships (Graduate, Teaching, Research)
- Personal

I've Been Accepted What Next?

General Processes for International Students After Being Accepted to Grad School

Maintaining Your Status

- Full Time Enrollment (minimum of 8 units or 9credits)
- Meet GPA requirements set by academic departments
- Provide updates to your international office (changes in address, finances, etc)
